Give Local Flathead's Fiesta for Philanthropy



This first time event in the Flathead Valley is a one day happening to encourage everyone to donate to their favorite local nonprofit. Hosted by the Flathead Community Foundation and Northwest Montana United Way, Give Local Flathead is part of the national Give LOCAL America campaign. Give Local Flathead's goal is to raise \$100,000 for nonprofit organizations serving the Flathead Valley. 2nd Annual Kootenai Trail Fundraiser



The second annual Kootenai Trail Fundraiser will be held in Eureka on May 16 from 10am – noon. The event encourages individuals to walk, run or bike the familyfriendly trail which goes from downtown Eureka to Lake Koocanusa. In 1997 Sunburst began efforts to turn the old unused railroad corridor into a "rails-to-trail", a public, non-motorized trail for hikers, bicyclists and horseback riders. Through many fits and turns over the years, the original project vision was finally realized in the summer of 2005 with the opening of the full 7.5 mile length of the Kootenai Trail. A grant from Montana Fish, Wildlife and Parks provided most of the funding for the Eureka segment of the trail with additional support from the US Forest Service. The trail crosses land owned by the US Forest Service, US Army Corps of Engineers, the railroad and a private ranch owner. Two years ago the private owner deeded an easement to Sunburst to help ensure that the trail would exist regardless of the ranch's ownership. It was a generous gift and means that each year funds need to be raised to cover Sunburst's cost of insurance on the trail. The annual event is also a great opportunity though to let the community know about the trail. This past year with a grant from the Montana Fish, Wildlife and Parks, Sunburst worked with a young man becoming an Eagle Scout to construct interpretive signs that are placed along the trail. Ellen Sullivan who works with the US Forest Service and serves on the Sunburst advisory board in Eureka, was instrumental in getting the signs designed. The signs provide information on the history of the area, local fauna and do's and don'ts concerning wildlife especially bears.

Polson Artists Selling Items

Numerous artistic consumers from Sunburst's Polson site have been working on developing a line of items they will sell over the summer at farmers markets. Large canvas shopping bags painted with bright designs as well as bird houses in the shape of teepees are some of the items that have been crafted. The proceeds from the sales will go to the artist who made each of the items and a small percentage going to Sunburst to help cover art supplies.

New Security Cameras in Kalispell

Thanks to a grant from Flathead Electric Cooperative's Round Up for Safety, Sunburst has installed new security cameras at the Kalispell site. The cameras will help monitor those rooms where medications are kept. Although the medications are kept in locked cabinets, there was concern about unauthorized individuals gaining access. The security cameras will serve as a deterrent as well as collect evidence if needed. The system was installed by Montana Technical Solutions which helped Sunburst find a system that was within the price range of the grant.
